



Situation UK


- Cases 254,195 (36,393)
- Easing of lockdown very cautious
- Restaurants may start to open around mid June
- Possibility of regional easing based on current Covid cases
- Confusion over schools starting
- Opening of garden centres and freedom to move around country
- All visitors to UK to go into Quarantine (14 days)
- Alcohol sales rose by 31.4% during lockdown
- Wine still favourite alcohol beverage in UK





Holland

Situation Holland

- Cases 45,064 (5,811)
- Events of more than 100 people banned until September 1st
- Restaurants can open September 1st
- · Borders closed
- Wage costs for staff grants for 3 months furlough
- No statistics available for wine sales during pandemic








Situation Switzerland

- Cases 30,699 (1,908)
- No lockdown implemented
- Ban on 5 or more individuals together
- 27 April easing of restrictions Hairdressers/construction etc
- Schools opened 11 May
- No new cases or fatalities reported 25 May
- Virtually normal from 8 June
- · Borders controlled
- No statistics available on wine sales






France

Situation France

- Cases 144,806 (28,332)
- France in total lockdown at this time
- No new measures until June
 15
- 450m Euros spent so far to shore up the economy
- Travel up to 100km allowed (with declaration of reason)
- No more than 10 people together
- · Red and Green zones
- Further announcements on reopening of restaurants expected June 2
- Large shopping centres closed
- Gradual reopening of schools








Situation Germany

- Cases 178,281 (8,247)
- High levels of testing
- All borders closed
- Administration state by state
- Short time working scheme similar to France and UK for staff
- Economy has contracted by 2.2% so now officially in recession
- Football now being played behind closed doors
- Gradual easing of restrictions
- Some states now reopening restaurants
- Some big German companies facing closure and bankruptcy



Situation Denmark

Cases 11,360 (562)

- From 27 May children under 11 go back to school
- One of the first to impose restrictions
- Peaked in March
- Slow down of restrictions since 15 April
- Contact tracing central to policy
- All borders closed
- 25 May borders will open to Nordic countries and Germany
- Restaurants & Cafes to reopen on May 18th
- Further re-opening on June 8

Ireland (Republic)

Situation Ireland (Republic)

- Cases 24,582 (1,604)
- Ireland still in lockdown
- Initial easing of controls 5 18
 May
- Testing key to success
- 140,000 people lost their jobs but payments are made whilst unemployed
- Good business support to reemploy staff after lockdown
- Supermarket sales busiest in history
- No plans as yet to ease lockdown





Sweden


Situation Sweden

- Cases 33,188 (3.992)
- Adopted the controversial herd immunity protocol
- Very high level of trust with authorities
- Lockdown considered not necessary
- Restaurants and bars open but with table restrictions and table service only
- Government paying half salary and workers part time
- Travel not advised
- Systembolaget seems to be operating as usual


Cases 56,810 (9,237)
Worst in Europe for deaths per capita
Belgium in lockdown
Borders closed
Breweries performing many of the deliveries of essential goods
Restaurants, bars and cafes closed
1.25m people temporarily out of

No plans visible for easing of lockdown and borders

Situation Finland


Cases 6,568 (306)
Situation very well controlled by government
Strict lockdown imposed
No movement to high population areas
Schools now reopening
Restaurants to be open by special arrangements 1st June
Alko servicing online deliveries at pick - up points
Stores remain open but with some restrictions



Finland







Situation Norway

Cases 8,309 (235)

Strict lockdown followed by lifting of controls Schools reopening Ban on foreign travel lifted Quarantine when return for 14 days June 1 bars to open with restrictions Borders with other countries closed - no foreigners allowed June 15 almost everything will open Social distancing remains in place - public events up to 50 people allowed Vinmonopolet open with some restrictions


