





RED VARIETIES

MALBEC



- Malbec is the flagship variety of Argentina and the one that best represents the local palate, which is quite paradoxical, considering that it's a varietal of French origin.
- Refined, vigorous and balanced, Malbec offers a diversity of styles that reflect its incredible potential. It offers a wide range of aromatic profiles associated with its terroir.
- Since 2011 it has been the most cultivated variety in the country. Leader in volume, quality and exports worldwide.

- **Aromas & Flavors**
Its aromas are reminiscent of cherries, strawberries, plums, raisins and black pepper and in some cases, cooked fruits. Aged in oak, it acquires notes of coffee, vanilla and chocolate. In the mouth it fills the palate with its sweet, silky tannins.

- **Pairings**
It is the quintessential red wine to accompany any dish: from the traditional Argentine barbecue to other dishes such as pasta, pizzas, tamales or sushi.



MALBEC & TERROIR

- The Malbec boom led us to wonder about what we knew about the variety.
- Researchers from INTA (National Institute of Agricultural Technology) and other private companies began to study it in detail.



■ **MAIN CONCLUSIONS**

- Malbec does not have its own varietal aromas, but shares aromatic families with the main red varieties.
- Malbec expresses different aromatic families that can be associated with terroir conditions.
- The temperature in the period of maturity is a key factor to achieving differentiated expressions.



RED VARIETIES

BONARDA



- It is the second most cultivated red variety after Malbec and one of the most traditional.
- Producers have recently discovered the potential of Bonarda as a varietal, its importance being evident by its adaptability to hot regions.

- **Aromas**

Raspberry aromas and subtle aniseed notes. When it is used in blends, it provides intensity and fruity notes.

- **Body & Colour**

It produces wine with good body and colour. Its structure allows it to be aged in barrels with very positive results.



RED VARIETIES

CABERNET SAUVIGNON



- Nicknamed "*the king of reds*". Together with Malbec, it is one of the varieties that has been most researched in recent years, in addition to offering different profiles depending where it is grown.
- Argentina offers at least three Cabernet styles with a particularity: they all come from continental climates, something very rare to find in other parts of the world.

■ Northwest

Amazing intensity of color with aromas of blackberries and green pepper.

■ Cuyo

It intensifies the fruity character described as ripe currants.

■ Patagonia

Mineral and earthy flavours are enhanced.



RED VARIETIES
SYRAH



- Historically used in the production of blends, in the last decade its cultivation has grown considerably.
- It adapts very well to regions of strong insolation such as the Tulum Valley, in San Juan, and the eastern areas of Mendoza.

- **Aromas & Texture**

In warmer regions, the wines present good colour and are fruit forward with textures and aromas that vary from floral, when young, to spicy after oak and bottle ageing.



RED VARIETIES

TEMPRANILLO

- With Spanish roots, it was in Argentina that Tempranillo found a prominent place to be shown to the world.
- Renowned for its strong tannins, its serene restlessness makes it one of the first grapes to mature.
- Aged in American oak, in the Spanish style, it achieves exceptional qualities and an excellent capacity to evolve in the bottle.

Aromas

In its youth, it exhibits simple fruity aromas of raspberries and blackberries, as opposed to reserve wines, which develop mouth-filling licorice and roasted sugar notes.



RED VARIETIES

MERLOT



- With relatively recent diffusion and great potential, Merlot begins to unfold with timid vigor.
- It has found its kingdom at high altitudes with fresh terroirs, common in the Uco Valley (Mendoza) and Río Negro Upper Valley Patagonia.

■ **Aromas**

Sweet pepper, cedar, currants and spices. With low production, it's a delicate wine, with an intense palate but without being too powerful.



RED VARIETIES

PINOT NOIR



- Famous for its antiquity and nobility, this grape produces mutations fast. Our Pinot Noir is particularly different from others because of its concentration, the result of the high number of light hours, the thermal amplitude and the type of soil.
- It is frequently used in the foundations of the best sparkling wines, while also producing very good red varietals.

■ **Aromas**

Good aromatic homogeneity of red and black fruits in which raspberry, blackberry, beets and earth stand out.

■ **Colour & Flavor**

Its color ranges from ruby to deep red. In the mouth it has very elegant flavours.



RED VARIETIES

CABERNET FRANC



- A relatively recent variety in Argentina. Originally from the humid climate of Bordeaux, it has adapted exceptionally well to the high altitude vineyards (+900msnm /2950 ft) and to the dry climate of Mendoza.
- Planted in the 90's to give strength to blends, without any plan for it to become a varietal in itself.
- Although the area planted with Cabernet Franc is minimal in relation to other reds, the variety excels in quality.

- **Aromas**

Aromas of red and black fruits, wild herbs and spices.

- **Colour & Flavor**

Deep violet color and very expressive wine. On the palate, it is voluptuous with good tension and firm tannins.



RED VARIETIES

TANNAT



- Originally from the southwest of France, more precisely from the Madiran AOC.
- It is a late sprouting, long cycle vine, characterised by being extremely productive and vigorous.
- Tannat has found an ideal terroir in Cafayate, since it is an astringent variety that in Salta achieves good maturity to round out its tannins and make them friendlier.

■ **Aromas**

In the north west of Argentina this strain is very aromatic, with pronounced notes of black fruit, menthol and graphite.

■ **Colour & Flavor**

It gives wines of intense colours, with great tannic intensity, with good acidity.



RED VARIETIES

PETIT VERDOT



- Originally from Bordeaux, Verdot arrived in Argentina as a blending grape. It has been gaining popularity as a varietal for its gustatory delights.
- It requires a lot of work in the vineyard, because it is a high yielding grape.
- Petit Verdot develops a very different personality in dry and sunny climates (Mendoza, San Juan and La Rioja).
- This allows for another ripening point, which makes its wines voluptuous and at the same time rounded.




Distribution by surface



WHITE VARIETIES
TORRONTÉS



- It is one of the most widespread white wines and has achieved remarkable international recognition.
- It is found only in Argentina and is considered the most famous *criolla* variety. There are three variants:
- Torrontés **Mendocino** and **Sanjuanino**: which are lighter and fresher, and **Riojano**, the most cultivated and expresses the best qualities for the production of fine wines, very fruity and dry at the same time; those from the Cafayate Valley (Salta) particularly stand out.

■ **Colour**

Light yellow wine that occasionally develops golden, green hues.

■ **Aromas**

Aroma of flowers (rose, jasmine and geranium), with the occasional appearance of spicy effluvia. Although its aromas anticipate a sweet wine, its flavour reveals fresh acidity.

■ **Pairings**

Pairs well with fish and seafood; regional cuisine of northwestern Argentina; spicy and well-seasoned foods, such as Thai, Indian, Chinese and Vietnamese.

WHITE VARIETIES

VIOGNIER



- A native grape of Bosnia, it was introduced in Argentina in 1993, where it has been gradually unveiled, becoming more and more interesting.
- Viognier is suitable for production in stainless steel vats and for fermentation and aging in oak barrels.

■ **Aromas**

When young, it is fresh with tones of flowers, tropical fruits and an unmistakable descriptor of caramel; while after a few years of oak ageing it presents almond aromas.



- Established in Argentina from the end of the 19th century, it develops very well in cool and moderate climates, such as the Uco Valley (Mendoza) and the Alto Valle del Río Negro (Patagonia). The palate has great personality that achieves a very good balance.


